

# Provincial Emergency Coordination Centre (PECC) Interface Fire Situation Overview September 10, 2006 1130 hrs

## OVERVIEW:

The Central Region Provincial Regional Emergency Operations Centre (PREOC) and the Provincial Emergency Coordination Centre (PECC) remain activated with staff continuing to provide agency coordination in support of local government.

The fires are not imminently threatening any structures.

The [Regional District of Okanagan-Similkameen](#) (RDOS) has issued two **evacuation alerts** to date:

- on Sept. 8, an **evacuation alert** was issued for the Cathedral Lakes Lodge.
- on Sept. 5, an **evacuation alert** was issued for residents of East Gate, Pasayten River Valley and parts of Manning Park, affecting approximately 180 homes/cabins in the alert area.

Both **evacuation alerts** remain in place. People are asked to be ready to leave on short notice.

The RDOS Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) in Princeton remains activated, with a public information line available to respond to enquires at 1-877-295-3790.

All 37 structures within the Pasayten River valley now have structural protection in place. This includes pumps, hose, and sprinklers. The Office of the Fire Commissioner, in conjunction with local fire departments, continues to assess and deploy structural protection units in the area.

BC Parks has also closed the majority of backcountry trails within Manning Park – details of this closure are [online here](#). Sections of Cathedral Park and portions of the Snowy Protected Area have also been closed. Refer to the BC Parks [website](#) for specific details.

Smoke may also create possible health concerns for people with breathing difficulties.

A public information line (1-877-498-3360) remains active, providing the latest information on the Tripod Complex (also known as the Similkameen Complex), southwest of Osoyoos. This fire has not crossed the border into Canada.

**DEFINITIONS:**

**Evacuation Alert:** Local authorities issue a warning in the form of an Evacuation Alert about an imminent threat to life and property, and people are asked to be ready to leave on short notice. When people choose to leave an area before or during the issuing of an alert, this is referred to as a voluntary evacuation.

**Evacuation Order:** Local authorities issue an Evacuation Order when the population is determined to be at imminent risk, and people must leave the area immediately. Local police or RCMP enforce Evacuation Orders.

**Evacuation Rescind:** An Evacuation Order or Alert is rescinded or lifted by local authorities when it is determined to be safe for residents to return home. An Evacuation Order may be reinstated if a threat returns.
