WEEKLY INCIDENT REPORT 03 MAY – 09 MAY 2004

ENVIRONMENTAL

On 04 May 04, a Dam Safety Incident occurred at the Arrow Lakes Generating Station at the Keenleyside Dam. There was a leak discovered in the generating channel adjacent to the dam. Members from Land and Water BC Dam Safety Unit, Comptroller of Water Rights, Columbia Power, RCMP, Regional District Central Kootenay, Regional District Kootenay Boundary, and the Emergency Coordinators in Trail and Castlegar were advised and monitored the situation.

On 06 May 04, the City of Coquitlam reported an ongoing problem with erosion and land slippage due to water diversion on Crown Land near Pipeline Road. A bank was undercut and was threatening to affect two homes, a water main and the only access road to the City's water reservoir at Coquitlam Lake. The Flood Hazard Management section of Water Land and Air Protection will assess the situation.

EVIDENCE SEARCH

On 05 May 04, the RCMP requested assistance with an evidence search 5 km west of Castlegar. The search was carried out on 06 May and included members from Castlegar SAR with mutual aid from the Beaver Valley, Rossland, Grand Forks, Nelson and Creston SAR teams.

MISCELLANEOUS

On 07 May 04, Saturna Island Rescue transported a patient from his residence to the Government Dock to transfer to BCAS for transport to hospital.

URBAN INTERFACE FIRE

On 03 May 04, a potential interface fire threatened the Logan Lake Golf Course. Ministry of Forests crews responded to suppress the fire. Logan Lake Search and Rescue assisted RCMP by restricting traffic flow until the situation was under control. Logan Lake Golf Course members continued to monitor the golf course overnight to ensure that any flare ups would be reported immediately.
