WEEKLY INCIDENT REPORT 15 - 21 NOV 2004

EVIDENCE SEARCH

On 19 Nov 04, RCMP requested the assistance of Shuswap SAR for an evidence search in Salmon Arm.

FLOOD

On 15 Nov 04, heavy rains combined with high tide caused the flooding of rivers and streams in the Sayward area. Sayward Road was closed to traffic until water levels receded. Two homes were flooded and two other families voluntarily relocated to stay with friends. The Ministry of Water, Land and Air Protection Flood Hazard specialist responded to restore a diverted creek back to its original channel. Advice on Disaster Financial Assistance was provided by PEP to those residents whose homes had sustained flood damage.

LANDSLIDE

On 15 Nov 04, three homes on Avonlee Road in Courtenay were deemed to be at risk from a landslide which had occurred due to heavy rainfall. Five individuals were evacuated and provided with alternate accommodations. A geotechnical assessment was conducted and work was completed to ensure the slope had stabilized prior to evacuees returning to their homes.
