WEEKLY INCIDENT REPORT 06 – 12 Dec 2004

DEBRIS FLOW

On 10 December 2004, a debris flow occurred on the In-shuck-ch Forest Services Road in the Douglas Corridor. The communities of Douglas Reserve and Tipella Reserve were cut off and approximately 45 people were impacted. Some school children were on the opposite side of the washout from the community and were billeted in Lower Skookumchuk for the night. Ministry of Forests responded to repair the road and restore access to the communities.

FLOOD

On 10 December 2004, heavy rainfall caused Meads Creek to overflow its bank and flood a residence on Youbou Road in Cowichan Valley Regional District. The Ministry of Transportation and the road maintenance contractor completed debris removal from the creek and conducted work in an effort to stabilize the bank and return the creek to its natural channel.

LANDSLIDE

On 11 December 2004, a rockslide approximately 12 kilometers north of Whistler closed Highway 99 between Whistler and Pemberton. A number of people were stranded on either side of the slide. Emergency Social Services volunteers responded and established a reception centre for those impacted. The highway was cleared and re-opened to single alternating traffic by later that afternoon.

On 11 December 2004, the Mission Emergency Coordinator requested assistance from the province to clean up material that slid from a residence on McQuinn Road onto Edwards Road in Mission as a result of heavy rains.

TERRORISM

On 6 December, 2004 an envelope containing white powder was received at the Tax Dept of Vancouver City Hall. As a safety precaution, the building was evacuated and the HAZMAT team responded. The contents of the envelope were analyzed and the substance was determined to be bread flour.
