WEEKLY INCIDENT REPORT: 08 AUG – 14 AUG 05

URBAN INTERFACE FIRE

On 09 Aug 05, an interface fire was reported two kilometres southeast of Oliver. The fire threatened the Regional District of Okanagan Similkameen (RDOS) and the Osoyoos Indian Reserve lands. The Ministry of Forests (MOF) aggressively fought the fire which was estimated to be a rank 3 and 400 hectares in size. There were an estimated 45 homes potentially at risk (30 homes in the RDOS and 15 in the Osoyoos Indian Band lands). Some of the residents evacuated their homes voluntarily and registered at the Oliver Community Centre where Emergency Social Services (ESS) volunteers had established a reception centre. The RDOS and the town of Oliver opened a joint Emergency Operations Centre with representation from First Nations and the province. The Provincial Regional Emergency Operation Centre (PREOC) in Kamloops and the Provincial Emergency Coordination Centre (PECC) were activated to level 1 and representatives from INAC and Office of the Fire Commissioner (OFC) monitored the situation and provided support to local government.

MISCELLANEOUS

On 08 Aug 05, clothing was provided for a family of three involved in an MVA near Smithers. All of their belongings were lost in the vehicle which went into a slough.
