WEEKLY INCIDENT REPORT 05 Sept – 11 Sept, 2005

ROCKSLIDE

On 10 Sep 2005, a rock the size of a minivan came down from an area thought to have been previously impacted by fire in Lillooet. The rock knocked a trailer off of its foundation and rendered the residence uninhabitable. Emergency Social Services responded and provided accommodations for two displaced residents. The Emergency Program Coordinator and the Fire Department attended and determined that although it appeared there were four more rocks set to fall, no further residents were at risk. Ministry of Forests was contacted to provide a geotechnical assessment and it was later determined that the slide area was not in a previous fire zone.

EVIDENCE SEARCH

On 10 Sep 2005, Coquitlam SAR responded at the request of RCMP to assist with an evidence search in the Buntzen Lake area.

MISCELLANEOUS

On 11 Sep 2005, Kelowna Fire Department members responded to provide assistance at the scene of an overturned float plane on Idabel Lake near Big White. The plane was taxiing for takeoff when it hit some rocks, flipped over and partially submerged near shore. The pilot was the only person on board and he managed to escape suffering only a minor hand injury.
