WEEKLY INCIDENT REPORT OCT 03 TO OCT 09 2005

DANGEROUS GOODS

On 03 Oct 05, a pump was inadvertently left running at Morning Star Nursery in the 1300 block of 176th Street in Surrey which caused a spill of approximately 6000 litres of diesel to the ground and into Sam Hill Creek. Weirs and booms were placed to prevent the diesel from migrating to the Campbell River. Due to the significant volume and potential risk to ground water and fish values the Ministry of Environment Response Officer (MOE RO) raised the incident to urgent status (Code 2). Quantum Environmental Services and McRae's were contracted to collect the diesel and conduct clean up. Representatives from MOE Headquarters, Environment Protection and Conservation Officer Service (COS), Environment Canada (EC), Public Safety and Emergency Preparedness Canada (PSEPC), Indian and Northern Affairs Canada (INAC), Regional Health Authority, PEP Headquarters, PEP Regional Office and City of Surrey Emergency Program Coordinator (EPC) were advised and monitored the remediation and clean up efforts.

BODY RECOVERY

On 04 Oct 05, Clearwater SAR responded to assist with the recovery of a body that was located under the Vavenby Bridge in the Thompson River.

On 08 Oct 05, Kent/Harrison SAR responded to assist the RCMP with a body recovery from Harrison Lake East. The body was retrieved and turned over to the Coroner.
