MISCELLANEOUS

On 18 Nov 05, the Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA) established an Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) in Abbotsford in response to animal health concerns at a Fraser Valley Duck and Goose farm. Depopulation of approximately 62,000 birds at one commercial site occurred and testing of birds at four other sites owned by the company were conducted by the BC Ministry of Agriculture and Lands. Testing of birds at 50 other farms within a 5 km radius of the initial site was also planned. Provincial Emergency Program (PEP) Regional Managers along with PEP Temporary Emergency Assignment Management System (TEAMS) staff responded to assist in the EOC.

On 20 Nov 05, Kent Harrison Emergency Social Services responded to assist 3 residents who were evacuated as a result of a gas leak at a substation near Tranmer Rd in Agassiz. Fire Dept, Duke Energy and Terasen Gas responded to the scene.
