DANGEROUS GOODS

On 29 Nov 05, six pressurized containers were located along with other drug lab waste in a field adjacent to Curlew Dr and Old Yale Rd in Abbotsford. The incident was raised to Code 2 "urgent status" by the Ministry of Environment Response Officer after an investigator and Police Officer who came in contact with the containers required medical attention. Hazco was contracted to collect samples, classify and remove the waste. The incident was downgraded to Code 1 "non urgent status" when it was determined the containers were in good condition and there was no risk of material release of discharge prior to removal. Ministry of Environment HQ, Environment Canada, PEP Regional Manager were advised and monitored the scene.

MISCELLANEOUS

On 01 Dec 05, two families were displaced from their residence in Saanich following a flood of unknown origin. Fire Department and BC Hydro attended and the power was disconnected to the residence for safety reasons. 3 adults, 3 children and 1 infant were provided with assistance.

FLOOD

On 01 Dec 05, an ice jam formation was reported at the western end of the Nechako River in the district near Campbell Road. The river rose 1.4 metres between 29-30 November and water was pushed up over the banks causing a flooding concern for one residence. All items were removed from their crawlspace as a precautionary measure. Vanderhoof Public Works crews filled sand bags and left them for homeowners to use as required. It was determined that Ministry of Environment Water Management had an agreement with Alcan which let them reduce storage in the Nechako Reservoir system by discharging more water than normal through the Kenny Dam. This discharge had been occurring since the onset of fall and the reservoir remains at higher than normal levels for this time of year. Discharges from the dam are constant and the cold weather should help to stabilize the ice pack. Ministry of Environment Dam Safety, Ministry of Environment Water Management, Bulkley Nechako Regional District, Provincial Emergency Program (PEP) Regional Manager, and PEP Flood Emergency Management Analyst were advised and monitored the situation.
